

College Scholarships for Prospective Mathematics and Science Teachers

The Southeast Ohio Center for Excellence in Mathematics and Science has approximately \$100,000 in scholarships funds for prospective middle level and high school math and science teachers who seek an initial license.

College juniors, seniors and graduate students wishing to become mathematics or science teachers may be eligible to receive a Noyce scholarship for up to \$17,000 per academic year for two years. These scholarships can be used at Ohio University, Shawnee State University, or the University of Rio Grande.

Noyce scholar recipients must be seeking an initial teaching license in science and or mathematics with plans to teach middle school or high school math or science in an Ohio Appalachia school district. Special consideration will be given to first generation college students who are residents of an Ohio Appalachian county. Students seeking a teaching license in Physical Science are strongly encouraged to apply.

Scholarships applications for the 2010-2011 academic year are now being accepted. Scholarship Application reviews will begin in April 2010. Recipients will be notified by mid-May 2010.

The Noyce Scholarship program is sponsored by the *National Science Foundation* and is administered by the *South East Ohio Center for Excellence in Mathematics and Science* (SEOCEMS).
